Our Lady of Victories RC Primary School

Our Lady of Victories RC Primary School first started making use of Radioanywhere's podcasting service in 2008. Headteacher, John Devlin, explained that the main reasons for introducing Radioanywhere into his schools curriculum were:

"To raise standards of Oracy, basically improving speaking and listening, to raise standards in IT but above all to have fun as part of the creative curriculum. Radio fits into everything so now all of our teachers plan to include Radio into all parts of the school curriculum. It helps to personalise learning, the students who aren't particularly academic shine when they get into the studio."

OLV started introducing the use of Radio / Podcasting in a small way. They had a lead teacher and small team of pupils who were interested in the idea. Once this had been piloted other members of staff wanted to become involved so the school had training organised with a local radio station. This led to additional ideas for use of Radio being introduced into the curriculum and the school chose to invest not only in the mobile podcasting equipment that they started with but also in a dedicated radio suite that is now built on site at school.
